

INTER-HANDLER TRANSFER OF PECANS RECEIPT

This receipt of pecans transferred between handlers is made in anticipation of the requirements of the Federal Marketing Order No. 986. In executing this form, the handlers respectively certify to the American Pecan Council (Council) and to the U.S. Department of Agriculture as to the correctness and completeness of their statement.

 2. Report inshell and shelled inter-handler transfers (in pounds)
 3. Report type of pecans and total inshell weight (Shelled pecan weight x 2 = inshell weight)
 4. A copy of this receipt should be kept by each handler and transferred to the Council upon request

BOTH PARTIES NEED TO KEEP A COPY OF THIS FORM

7 U.S.C. § 986.29 Pecans.

(a) *Pecans* mean and include any and all varieties or subvarieties of Genus: *Carya*, Species: *illinoensis*, expressed also as *Carya illinoensis* (*syn. C. illinoenses*) including all varieties thereof, excluding hicans, that are produced in the production area and are classified as:

(1) *Native or seedling pecans* harvested from non-grafted or naturally propagated tree varieties;

(2) *Improved pecans* harvested from grafted tree varieties bred or selected for superior traits of nut size, ease of shelling, production characteristics, and resistance to certain insects and diseases, including but not limited to: Desirable, Elliot, Forkert, Sumner, Creek, Excel, Gloria Grande, Kiowa, Moreland, Sioux, Mahan, Mandan, Moneymaker, Morrill, Cunard, Zinner, Byrd, McMillan, Stuart, Pawnee, Easter and Western Schley, Wichita, Success, Cape Fear, Choctaw, Cheyenne, Lakota, Kanza, Caddo, and Oconee; and

(3) *Substandard pecans* that are blowouts, cracks, stick-tights, and other inferior quality pecans, whether native or improved, that, with further processing, can be cleaned and eventually sold into the stream of commerce.

(b) The Council, with the approval of the Secretary, may recognize new or delete obsolete varieties or subvarieties for each category.
